Ted Hughes – Iron Man

Melding science fiction with fairy tale, this book tells the story of a aigantic metal robot who is discovered by a young boy, Hogarth. The Iron Man proceeds to devour farm machinery until the farmers rise up against him. This novel contains themes of bravery, prejudice, and irrational fear. The book has a range of chapters that will support a writing outcome this term, with cross curricular links to our science topic of materials. Key chapters will be available on Showbie later in the term. We will also be using this text to support our reading lessons.



Uniform

Home Learning

Your child must read at home, each night wherever possible, in order to make good progress. Parents/carers can help pupils by reading alongside with them and by asking questions in relation to the text. Your child will continue to receive weekly spellings alongside additional maths tasks. These will be set on Friday and must be completed by the following Friday. Children are expected to read every day and parents/carers need to acknowledge this through a signature once a week. The journals are checked in school regularly.

Physical Education

P.E. will be taught on a Monday for 5TS and a Tuesday for 5SA. The lessons will be based on throwing, catching and passing through a variety of team games. Children can wear a PE kit for the duration of the day when they have a PE lesson. As the weather is now starting to become colder the pupils are expected to bring in warmer, suitable clothing to stay warm.

Science topic- Materials

The next topic will comprise a range of lessons based on materials. Children will:

- Compare and group together everyday materials based on their properties.
- Know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution.
- Understand the particular use of materials based on evidence from fair tests.
- Explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials and understand that this type of change is usually irreversible.

This term, we will explore the value of **peace**. We explore our values in depth through assemblies, PSHE lessons and across the wider curriculum. We will also be exploring the theme of **tolerance**.
