

This novel has a range of chapters that lend themselves perfectly to a range of writing outcomes including short stories, persuasive arguments, and the description of settings/characters. We will also be using this text to support our reading lessons.



Uniform

Home Learning

Your child must read at home, each night wherever possible, in order to make good progress. Parents/carers can help pupils by reading alongside with them and by asking questions in relation to the text. Your child will continue to receive weekly spellings alongside additional maths and English tasks. These will be set on Friday and must be completed by the following Thursday. Children are expected to read every day and parents/carers need to acknowledge this through a signature once a week. The journals are checked in school regularly. During this term, the children will also receive a range of CGP books to complete as homework.

Physical Education

P.E. will be taught on a Mondays and Wednesdays for 6DM and Wednesdays and Thursdays for 6SO. The lessons will be based on activities linked to dance. Children can wear a PE kit for the duration of the day when they have a PE lesson. As the weather is now starting to become colder the pupils are expected to bring in warmer, suitable clothing to stay warm.

Science topic- Electricity

The next topic will comprise of a range of topics. Children will be able to:

- Associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit
- Compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches
- Use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.
