Termly topic

Our topic this term is All About Me!

This topic really helps the children to learn more about themselves, their families, our community and locality.

The stories we will be focusing on this term are- 'Hello', 'So Much!', 'Peepo' and 'Super duper You!'

Towards the end of the term we will also be learning about Chinese New Year.

To support our topic this term we are asking for the children to bring in a photo of their parent/s at a similar age of 3 or 4 years, we will then use these to look at features, similarities and differences in ourselves and our families.

Getting dressed:

As the weather continues to get colder we want to help the children learn to put on their winter coats and gloves independently. It would be very helpful if families could also encourage their children to practise this at home. Please also ensure that ALL items of clothing are clearly labelled.



Uniform:

Please ensure your child wears full school uniform each day. This includes a grey Wingfield jumper/cardigan (with school logo), a white polo shirt and grey skirt, dress, shorts or trousers. Children should wear plain black shoes or trainers.

Please support us by also ensuring that your child does not wear jewellery – this includes stud earrings

Whole school project: Joesph Coelho

This term our whole school project is based around the poems of Joseph Coelho.

In nursery we will be reading his poem 'I spy" where we will be exploring how and why we use our senses for ourselves and the environments around us. We will also be reading the poem 'I am a...writer' where we will draw inspiration to help us understand ourselves more. What we are good at, what our skills are and what we are proud of.



Reading

Each term your child recives a Reading Journal, we use this a form of communication to log how often you are able to read at home and notes of when we hear the children read in school. Books are changed weekly and we encourage you to read with your child every evening. 10 minutes of listening to stories can make all the difference with helping your child develop a love for stories and also support with enabling your child to create stories of their own. Please support us by sending your childs reading record book into school on their reading day.
