Showbie – Home Learning

Uniform

Please make sure that all children are in full school uniform every day; a grey Wingfield jumper (displaying the Wingfield logo), a white polo shirt and grey trousers/skirts/shorts. Please label all items of clothing with your child's name. Children should wear black shoes. Please support us by ensuring that your child does not wear jewellery, nail varnish or short skirts. Boys should not have any patterns shaved in their hair. Please also ensure that your child brings a water bottle with them to school everyday. On sunny days sun cream should be applied to your child before school. If you would like your child to bring a bottle of sun cream to apply during the day then please discuss with their class teacher first. Please note, sun cream cannot be applied by a school adult, it must be applied by the child.

Story Time - Reading at Home

Please support your child in developing their fluency and love for reading by reading regularly with them at home.

Top Tips for an enjoyable reading experience:

- Set aside a quiet time with no distractions. Ten to fifteen minutes is usually long enough.
- Be positive. Boost your child's confidence with frequent praise for their reading achievements.
- Model fluent reading and accurate pronunciation of unfamiliar words.
- Talk about the books; the pictures, the characters, how they think the story will end, their favourite part and any unfamiliar vocabulary.
