Welcome back to our final term of Year 4 for this academic year! We hope you had a relaxing half-term break and are ready for an exciting term of learning.

Learning this term:

This term in **English**, we will be using a variety of texts as stimulus for our learning. We will begin the term by reading *Race to the Frozen North* by Catherine Johnson and writing a short story about what it would be like to explore the Arctic. In **maths**, we will be looking at statistics, specifically focusing on interpreting and collecting data. We will then present our findings in a chart of choice. We will then continue to consolidate our knowledge of different topics we have learnt about this year. In **history**, we will be continuing to study the Saxons, Scots and Vikings and we will explore the following question: *how have key events and people changed the way in which the country is governed?* In **R.E.**, we will be looking at the religion of Islam and learning about the sacred pilgrimage that is Hajj. In **science**, we will be learning about living things and their habitats and will learn about how environmental changes may have an impact on a living thing.

Your child will also receive weekly 'Spellings' and 'Talk Words' to practise each week. Please also encourage your child to regularly practise cursive handwriting of their spelling words at home.
