

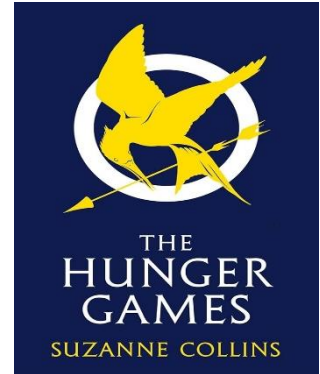
Year 6 Newsletter

We hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas and New Year. It has been a very successful first term at Wingfield for everyone involved in year 6. The children have worked really hard since September, showing great levels of enthusiasm and resilience. We are looking forward to seeing what 2025 has to offer! Mr. Savage and Miss. Bradley.

Using *The Hunger Games* as a writing stimulus, Year 6 will explore creative and analytical writing through two engaging tasks. First, they will craft a fashion article inspired by the dazzling outfits and dramatic moments of the opening ceremony, honing their descriptive language and persuasive techniques to capture the glitz and spectacle of the Capitol. Next, they will delve into character perspectives with a split recount, stepping into the contrasting voices of President Snow and Katniss Everdeen. This activity will challenge their narrative skills as they convey distinct motivations, emotions, and tones, deepening their understanding of character and viewpoint.



Physical Education

In Year 6 PE lessons, the children will be learning Tag Rugby with a focus on developing key skills in passing and movement. They will practice accurate, controlled passes to maintain possession and explore dynamic movement techniques to create space and evade defenders. Emphasis will be placed on understanding team tactics, such as supporting teammates, anticipating plays, and working collaboratively to outmanoeuvre opponents. These sessions not only enhance their physical abilities but also foster teamwork, strategic thinking, and a deeper appreciation of the game's tactical aspects.

Science topic- Animals including Humans.
