

Welcome back to school and to Year 5!

Whole School Project- The Secret Garden

Our whole school project is 'The Secret Garden'. In the text, Mary Lennox, a spoilt, recently orphaned child finds herself living a lonely existence when she is sent to live in her uncle's manor in Yorkshire. When Mary discovers the secret garden she and her sickly cousin undergo a journey of rejuvenation and renewal inspired by the garden. Over the next few weeks, the children will be producing several writing outcomes inspired by the story's characters and themes. In year 5, these will include a narrative based on the moment the garden is discovered and a poem around the text's themes. We will also be visiting Manor House Gardens (Lee) to inspire our writing and art outcomes.



Uniform

Home Learning

Your child must read at home each night to make good progress. Parents/carers can help pupils by reading alongside with them and by asking questions in relation to the text. This can be based on the language that the author uses, predictions /inferences that can be made from the text and by also encouraging the children to write down any words that they may not understand. We have our own 'Word of the Day' display in our classroom, and we are always keen to share new vocabulary with the class.

Your child will continue to receive weekly spellings and times tables challenges. These will be set on Friday and must be completed by the following Friday. It is vital that homework and reading is taken seriously, particularly as the pupils are now becoming independent learners and this is good practice to prepare them for Year 6. Pupils are expected to read every day and record their progress in their home learning journals. Parents/carers need to acknowledge this through a signature once a week. The journals are checked weekly.

Foundation topics

In our science lessons this term, our topic is Forces. Children will be taught about gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction, carrying out investigations to explore the ways these forces behave. In history, we will be learning about the Golden Age of Islam and the most significant achievements of the Islamic Empire. Our R.E. topic is Christians Festivals, and in PSHE we will be exploring the concepts of identity and individuality.

School timings

Classrooms are open from 8.40am to begin some early morning learning. Please ensure your child is in school by 9.00 am every day, ready for learning. Please note that if your child arrives after 9.05 am, they will have to be brought to the main office to sign in.

Physical education

This half term, we will focusing on counter balancing and net and wall games. On the class's P.E days, children can wear their P.E. kits for the duration of the day.
