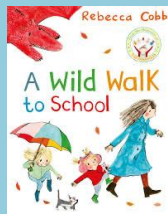
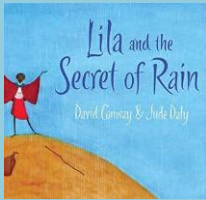


Hello everyone! Welcome back to our final half term. We hope you had a lovely half term break and are ready for another exciting term of learning!

## Curriculum

Here are some of the subjects we will cover this half term:

In **English**, we will be exploring texts about ships, pirates and the quest for gold. We will engage in both creative writing and writing a recount of our memorable trip to the Horniman Museum. In **Maths**, we will apply our understanding of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables to explore division, as well as delve into measurement, position and direction. This term in **Science**, our focus will be plants. We will investigate different types of plants, learn about their features and growth, and explore the natural world around us. Meanwhile, in **RE**, we will continue our learning about Judaism by exploring important Jewish festivals, traditions and stories.

- 1CT – Thursday, Friday

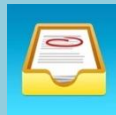
On P.E. days, children will be expected to attend school dressed in their P.E. kit for the whole day – normal school uniform is not required on these days. As such, children should not need to keep their P.E. kit in school during the week.

- sensible running trainers/plimsoles

## Showbie – Home Learning

Please continue to read with your child each day and record what they have read in their Home Learning Journal.



## Uniform

Please make sure that all children are in full school uniform every day; a grey Wingfield jumper (displaying the Wingfield logo) and a white polo shirt and grey trousers/skirts/shorts. **Please label all items of clothing with your child's name.** Children should wear black shoes. Please support us by ensuring that your child does not wear jewelry, nail varnish or short skirts. Boys should not have any patterns shaved in their hair. Please also ensure that your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day. On sunny days, sun cream should be applied to your child before school. If you would like your child to bring a bottle of sun cream to apply during the day, then please discuss with their class teacher first. Please note, sun cream cannot be applied by a school adult, it must be applied by the child.

## Story Time - Reading at Home

Please support your child in developing their fluency and love for reading by reading regularly with them at home.

### Top Tips for an enjoyable reading experience:

- Set aside a quiet time with no distractions. Ten to fifteen minutes is usually long enough.
- Be positive. Boost your child's confidence with frequent praise for their reading achievements.
- Model fluent reading and accurate pronunciation of unfamiliar words.
- Talk about the books; the pictures, the characters, how they think the story will end, their favourite part and any unfamiliar vocabulary.
